Younger toddlers will watch and react, while older toddlers will point to or name the characters. Older Toddler Challenge: Older toddlers will choose a puppet and help "talk" or act out part of the story.

	Will explore light and shadows by pointing.	Will match objects to their shadows.

Activity: The teacher will place cutouts of spring animals and insects (bird, butterfly, caterpillar, worm) and their matching shadow cutouts on the table. Younger toddlers will match each animal to its shadow, while older toddlers will observe and describe differences between a caterpillar and a worm (e.g., caterpillars have tiny legs, worms do not).

Older Toddler Challenge:

Older toddlers will **point out and explain how a caterpillar and worm are different** using pictures or cutouts.

	Will explore materials and stick items onto the nest.	Will assemble materials to create a bird nest.

Activity: The teacher will provide materials to **create a bird nest** using:

- Brown paper (cut into a half-circle) for the nest
- Brown yarn for twigs
- Colored construction paper for birds
- Feathers and wiggly eyes for decoration

Younger toddlers will touch and explore materials before sticking them onto the paper nest. Older toddlers will place the yarn "twigs" carefully and glue the birds inside the nest.

Older Toddler Challenge:

Older toddlers will talk about where birds build their nests and why they need twigs and feathers.

	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	Will watch and feel objects moving in the wind.	Will predict how objects will move before testing them.

Activity: If indoors, the teacher will use a small fan to blow lightweight objects like scarves, feathers, and paper leaves while toddlers observe how they move. If outside, toddlers will use real leaves, flower petals, and twigs to test how the wind moves different objects. Younger toddlers will watch and feel the wind moving objects, while older toddlers will guess which object will move the farthest before testing.

Older Toddler Challenge:

Older toddlers will **compare how different materials move** and explain why some objects move more easily than others.

Activity: The teacher will sing a spring-themed rhyming song (e.g., "Spring is Here") while toddlers clap and move to the rhythm. Younger toddlers will listen and imitate clapping, while older toddlers will try to sing parts of the song and do hand motions.

Older Toddler Challenge:

Older toddlers will think of another rhyming word that fits in the song.
