Challenge: Older preschoolers will try to find and point out sight words during the read-aloud (e.g., "go," "camp," "the").

Activity: Read aloud *The Berenstain Bears Go to Camp*. Talk about what the bear family does at camp. Invite children to share their own camping experiences or thoughts.

Challenge: Older preschoolers search for sight words during the read-aloud and name them aloud.

Challenge: Older preschoolers highlight sight words and identify letters in key camping words.

Activity: Create a Story Using Camping Flashcards

Each child selects flashcards to build a short camping story. Younger children may dictate their story while older ones write or trace words. Children will share their stories aloud.

Challenge: Older preschoolers will independently write 2-3 sight words used in their story.
