Activity: Animal Plate Painting Infants will create their own artwork using sponge or fingertip painting on pre-cut animal shapes or paper plates. The teacher will offer orange paint and narrate the infant's movements while encouraging sensory expression through color, shape, and feel.

	Infants may respond to sound by turning head or smiling.	Infants may shake instrument or move body rhythmically.
Activity: Shake & Sound Time The teacher will introduce small, infant-safe shakers while playing forest-themed background sounds (e.g., bird calls, gentle wind). Infants are encouraged to explore sound-making, either independently or with adult support, to build auditory creativity and rhythm awareness.

Activity: Wiggle & Freeze				
The teacher will lead a playful dance session using music with clear start-stop cues. Infants will be encouraged to wiggle, sway, and bounce to the music. During the “freeze,” the teacher will pause and smile or pose, modeling movement control in a joyful way.

	Infants may press sponge with assistance and watch paint marks.	Infants may press sponge independently or repeat stamping motion.
Activity: Track Painting Infants will use sponges cut into simple paw or footprint shapes to stamp across paper. Teachers will guide the stamping and narrate with playful phrases like “The bear walked here!” This offers process-based creative exploration while reinforcing cause and effect.

	Infants may swipe or dab paint on paper with assistance.	Infants may place eyes, ears, or nose on their painting independently or with guided support.
<p>Activity: Paint My Bear</p> <p>Infants will be given a bear outline to paint using non-toxic brown paint. After painting, the teacher will offer pre-cut eyes, a nose, and ears for infants to place wherever they choose on their bear. This encourages expressive choice, fine motor skills, and ownership of their creation- even if everything ends up in one corner!</p>
