### Activity: W is for Worm Craft

Provide paper circles for children to glue together to form a worm. Encourage arranging them in a wiggly pattern and adding eyes, a mouth, or other features. While working, reinforce the /w/ sound and name other W words. Display worms on a “W is Wonderful” bulletin board.

### Activity: Family Collage with Rectangle Frames

Experiment with fast, slow, loud, and soft sounds. End with a “band performance” where everyone plays together.
