Activity: Pond Music Jam

Provide a variety of percussion instruments (shakers, drums, rhythm sticks). Invite children to explore how they sound while pretending they're at a pond. Play call-and-response rhythms based on animal sounds (e.g., "ribbit-ribbit" beat). Let children experiment freely, then perform short group jams. Older preschoolers may try echo rhythms or lead the group.

Activity: Pond Painting with Green & Blue Brushes

Provide blue and green paint with large brushes or sponges. Invite children to paint their own pond scenes including water, grass, lilypads, and/or animals. Focus on the process of exploration, mixing, and movement. Older preschoolers may describe the scene or choose to add specific pond creatures using stamps or stencils.

Activity: Sing & Dance: "5 Little Speckled Speckled Frogs"

Lead a group music and movement session with the classic pond song "5 Little Speckled Frogs." Use finger puppets or cutouts for visuals. Sing together while acting out frogs jumping into the pond. Encourage older children to add creative frog moves or help lead verses. Explore tempo by singing it fast, slow, or silly.

Give children a turtle template and small paper squares in greens and browns. Let them glue the squares onto the turtle shell, creating a mosaic look. Discuss color choices and patterns. Older preschoolers may arrange squares in rows or patterns and name what makes their turtle unique.

Activity: Tissue Paper Lily Pad Art

Provide round paper bases and green tissue paper. Children tear, scrunch, and glue the tissue onto their lily pad. Add flower cutouts or let children make their own. Focus on sensory and color exploration. Older children may describe pond settings where their lily pad would float or add drawn frogs.
