### Activity: Graph the Weather

Begin circle time by asking children about the day's weather. Add a symbol to a class weather graph (sun, cloud, rain). Count and compare how many of each weather type you've seen this week. Use questions like "Which one has the most?" to support math talk and classification skills.

### Activity: Number Hop (1-16)

Set out large number cards 1 through 16 in a hopscotch-style path. Call out a number and have children hop to it. Say the number together as they land. This activity helps reinforce number recognition while using movement to boost engagement.

### Activity: Sun Rays Clothespin Count

Each child receives a paper sun with a number (1-10) in the center. Using clothespins, they attach the correct number of "rays" around the circle. This hands-on activity supports one-to-one correspondence and counting fluency.

### **Activity: Sort & Count Blue Things**

Invite children to help collect blue items from around the room. Then, sort them into categories (e.g., toys, blocks, clothes). Count each group and compare quantities. Ask, "Which group has more? Which has less?" to practice comparative thinking.

### **Activity: Create Sunny Patterns**

Using cut-outs of suns and clouds (or printed pictures), guide children to create AB patterns (sun-cloud-sun-cloud). Older students can try ABB or AAB patterns. Encourage them to say the pattern out loud and explain it: "I see a sunny, sunny, cloudy!"
