Activity: Pond Habitat Sensory Bin Exploration

Create a sensory bin filled with water beads, toy frogs, turtles, rocks, plastic plants, and other pond-themed items. Invite children to explore the bin using their senses. Encourage them to describe what they feel and see: "Is the rock smooth or bumpy?" Older preschoolers can sort animals vs. plants or discuss what belongs in a pond.

Resources/Materials

- Sensory bin with pond items
- Plastic animals, pebbles, fake plants
- Towels for cleanup

Activity: Frog Life Cycle Puzzle + Chart

Introduce a visual chart showing the frog life cycle: egg, tadpole, froglet, adult frog. Let children build the sequence using a puzzle or picture cards. Discuss the transformation, emphasizing what happens at each stage. Older preschoolers can retell the life cycle or draw their favorite stage.

Activity: Playdough Frog Pond Habitat

Set out green, blue, and brown playdough along with small pond animal toys, sticks, rocks, and leaves. Invite children to build their own frog pond. Discuss what belongs in a pond and how frogs live there. Older preschoolers may describe how frogs use lily pads, where they hide, or what they eat.

Activity: Parts of a Frog Poster

Show a large poster or diagram of a frog. Label key body parts like eyes, legs, webbed feet, and tongue. Play a game: "Touch the frog's eye!" Older preschoolers can describe how frogs use each part, like jumping with their legs or catching flies with their tongue.
