Each infant will take turns exploring their reflection using a handheld baby-safe mirror. The teacher will model simple emotions like "happy face," "surprised face," or "kissy face," encouraging imitation and emotional recognition. This activity builds early identity and emotional expression.

Activity: Gentle Touch Time The teacher will model gentle pats or strokes using a soft cloth or plush animal. With language like "gentle hands," the teacher helps infants explore safe touch and practice early social cues. This lays the groundwork for understanding personal space and kind interaction.

Activity: Who Loves You? Song

During circle or lap time, the teacher sings a personalized version of the "Who Loves You?" song (e.g., "Who loves Mia? Mommy loves Mia!"). Infants are invited to hear their name and see family photo cues, building self-esteem and reinforcing loving relationships.
