Activity: **Shell Art (Paint + Glitter)**

Provide paper plate shell shapes and watercolor or tempera paint. Let children decorate their shell however they choose and offer glitter for optional sparkle. Encourage discussion about their color choices or design. This activity builds creative confidence and artistic exploration.

Activity: Coconut Tree Art with Name Letters
