	May point to beach items (like a pail or hat) when named.	May describe their own beach experiences or name favorite items they see in the book.

Activity: Read *We're Going to the Beach* aloud with an expressive voice, pausing often to explore illustrations. Encourage children to name items: "Who sees the towel?" For older preschoolers, ask questions like, "Have you ever been to the beach?" or "What do you take to the beach?" Support language development through conversation tied to the images and story.

	May remember key objects or actions from the book and point or say words.	May retell part of the story or act out events using props or visuals.

Activity: Re-read *We're Going to the Beach*. Use props or visual cues to help children recall events. Ask, "What happened first?" and "What did they bring with them?" Younger children can participate by repeating key words. Encourage everyone to move like they're going to the beach (carrying bags, walking on sand).

	May point to or identify a few letters in their name.	May say the alphabet or predict what happens next in the story.

Activity: Read *Chicka Boom Boom*. Encourage children to listen for the letters in their name. As each letter climbs the tree, pause and let them say the letter. Ask older students questions like, "What happens when all the letters go up?" and "What letter comes next?"

Activity: Read *Islandborn* aloud with pauses to explore illustrations. Encourage children to share what they see. Ask, "Who do you think this is in the picture?" and "Does your neighborhood look like this?" Promote personal storytelling and connection to the text.
