#### Activity: Gentle Music

Play soft, soothing music while sitting close and making warm eye contact. Name feelings as you listen together: "The music is calm; our bodies feel calm." Pause and lower the volume to help infants notice changes. Invite older infants to tap or sway with you, matching slow and fast tempos. End with a quiet breath and a smile to model regulation.

#### Activity: Bubble Watching

Blow a few bubbles, pausing to let infants watch them float and land. Cue "wait... now pop!" to practice short moments of control. Repeat several rounds, gradually increasing the wait time. Praise gentle reaching and calm bodies, reinforcing self-control with simple words.

#### Activity: Comfort Time

Create a quiet corner with dimmed lights and soft voices. Offer a familiar plush or puppet while you label feelings: "You looked tired; we're resting." Rock or pat gently, then pause to notice calm breathing together. Encourage older infants to hold their comfort toy and take a slow breath with you.
