Activity: Tummy Tunes

Place infants on a soft mat for tummy time while playing calm, instrumental island-themed music. Position a soft mirror or toy nearby for interest. Gently narrate: "We're listening to music while we stretch." This supports physical and emotional comfort while reinforcing self-awareness during independent exploration.

Activity: Stretch & Soothe

During quiet time, guide the infant through gentle leg and arm stretches while speaking or singing softly. Use comforting phrases like, "Stretch up high!" or "Bend down low." Maintain eye contact and provide a steady rhythm. This builds body awareness and promotes calm interactions with caregivers.

Activity: Puppet Snuggles

Use a soft animal or emotion-face puppet to engage during lap or circle time. Say, "This is Happy Bear! Can you give bear a hug?" Use the puppet to show different emotions with matching tone of voice. This activity nurtures emotional recognition and relationship building through playful comfort.

Activity: Emotion Face Board

Display a board or book showing simple baby-friendly faces: happy, sad, surprised. Point to each and describe: "This baby is happy! Look at that big smile." Allow infants to react naturally. Older infants may begin mimicking facial expressions, building emotional awareness.

Activity: Cozy Rug Rest

Create a calming area with soft rugs, pillows, and soothing music. Encourage infants to rest, lay, or sit comfortably with a stuffed animal or lovey. Use quiet voices and gentle strokes to support relaxation. This allows for emotional regulation and rest, especially after an active morning.
