	May listen quietly to a familiar voice or look at the reader's face during storytime.	May smile, vocalize, or pat the book while listening. May begin to mimic animal sounds or look at pictires with interest.

Activity: Book Snuggle - Class Two at the Zoo

Hold infants during individual or small group storytime and read *Class Two at the Zoo* slowly and expressively. Focus on your voice and facial expressions to keep infants engaged. Emphasize rhyming words and make simple animal sounds: "The lion says ROAR!" Encourage older infants to pat the pages or point at animals. For younger infants, hold the book above during tummy time or cuddle them while reading face-to-face. Repetition helps build word recognition and language comfort.

	May focus on the caregiver's mouth while speaking or smile at familiar sounds.	May vocalize back, imitate animal sounds, or respond with gestures or movements.

Activity: Animal Sound Talk

Use stuffed zoo animals or picture cards to introduce animal sounds. Hold one up and say, "This is a lion. ROAR!" Pause and smile to allow infants to respond. Encourage sound mimicry or eye tracking. Repeat sounds often and with enthusiasm. This activity strengthens early listening and expressive skills through repetition and vocal play.

	May respond to voice inflection or turn head toward sound.	May vocalize, bounce, or clap when excited by a loud or funny part of the story.

Activity: Book Snuggle - Never, Ever Shout in a Zoo

During lap time or floor time, read with soft, soothing intonation and occasional exaggerated "shout" or "whisper" to introduce volume. Pause and encourage infants to react. Point to animal illustrations and repeat key words. Reinforce engagement through cuddles and smiles.

	May show recognition through facial expressions or quiet focus.	May turn pages with help or anticipate favorite parts.

Activity: Book Flip Time

Re-read *Class Two at the Zoo* and focus on page turning. Let infants help flip stiff or laminated pages. Point and name the animals again. Repetition encourages comprehension and memory. Use the same sounds and phrases from earlier in the week to build recognition.

Activity: Animal Puppet Peek

Using soft animal puppets, engage infants in simple peekaboo interactions. "Peekaboo, it's the monkey!" Encourage back-and-forth sounds. For older infants, let them touch the puppet or choose between two. This activity fosters emerging turn-taking and vocal expression.
