### Activity: Read *I Won a What?* + Discuss

Introduce the book *I Won a What?* by showing the cover and asking children to predict what the story might be about. Read the book aloud with enthusiasm, pausing to point out illustrations and ask guiding questions about what is happening. Encourage children to share their thoughts about the surprise prize in the story and how the characters feel. After reading, discuss what each child might like to win at a fair and why, promoting conversation, imagination, and recall skills.

Indicators	<b>Younger Preschool</b>  May describe what they see in a picture using a single word or gesture.	<b>Older Preschool</b>  May tell a part of the story using complete sentences, adding descriptive details.

### Activity: The Midnight Fair

Read *The Midnight Fair* (picture book) and invite children to create the story using their imagination. Explain that the book has no words, so they will be the storytellers. Show each page, calling on different children to say what they think is happening. Encourage descriptive language and creative thinking as they imagine sights, sounds, and actions at the fair. Record some of their ideas on chart paper to revisit later in the week.

### Activity: The Pigeon Will Ride a Roller Coaster

Read *The Pigeon Will Ride a Roller Coaster!* aloud, using expressive voices and dramatic pauses to capture attention. Pause at key moments to ask children what they think Pigeon is feeling and what might happen next. After reading, guide the group in sequencing the story by recalling what happened at the beginning, middle, and end. This helps develop comprehension, prediction, and sequencing skills.

Indicators	<b>Younger Preschool</b>  May point to or name characters when shown pictures from the book.	<b>Older Preschool</b>  May retell key events in order with minimal prompts.

**Activity: Review I Won a What?**

Revisit *I Won a What?* and read selected pages aloud. Invite the group to help retell the story by describing what happens in each part, using the illustrations as prompts. Ask questions like, “What prize did they win?” and “How did they feel?” Encourage children to connect the story to their own experiences of winning prizes or going to the fair.

**Activity: Review The Pigeon Will Ride a Roller Coaster**

Review *The Pigeon Will Ride a Roller Coaster!* by reading key pages aloud. Then invite children to act out the story, assigning roles for Pigeon, friends, and the roller coaster. Encourage them to use expressive voices and body movements to show excitement or nervousness. This activity strengthens recall, expressive language, and confidence in public speaking.
