	May track rattle movement with eyes or react with coos.	May reach for rattles or babble along with sounds.

Activity: Rattles

Shake rattles near infants, varying the speed and direction to capture attention. Emphasize the /t/ sound softly between shakes, saying "t-t-t" to introduce the letter T. Tap the rattle once at a time to practice the week's number 1. Pause to let infants process and encourage reaching or vocal responses, building early sound awareness and sensory engagement.

	May watch teacher's mouth while listening to sounds.	May try to imitate sounds with babbles or mouth movements.

Activity: T Sounds

Sit face-to-face with infants and softly repeat the /t/ sound, exaggerating mouth movements for visual interest. Show a large foam or cardboard letter T as you say the sound. For older infants, encourage them to try forming their lips or tongue in response. Pair sounds with gentle touch or hand motions to keep them engaged and make phonics playful.

Activity: Animal Sounds

Make simple animal sounds (e.g., "moo," "baa") while showing soft animal toys or pictures. Add a playful twist by repeating the /t/ sound between animals ("t-t-tiger!") to reinforce letter T. Pause after each sound to watch infants' reactions and celebrate coos or babbles. Repeat favorites to strengthen early listening skills and sound recognition.

Activity: Claps

Sit facing infants and gently clap your hands together once at a time, counting aloud "one clap" to reinforce number 1. Add rhythmic T sounds, like "t-t-t," with each clap. For older infants, help them clap their hands or clap along with them to build motor skills and awareness of sound patterns.

Activity: Bells

Use small wrist or handheld bells, shaking them gently in front of infants. Move bells in circles while repeating /t/ sounds, like "t-t-t" to combine phonics, shape, and sound play. Pause between shakes to allow infants time to react. For older infants, offer bells to hold and shake with supervision, encouraging active participation.
