Activity: Peekaboo				
Use a round blanket or scarf to play peekaboo, hiding your face and then popping out with an excited “peekaboo!” Emphasize “circle” by calling the blanket a “circle blanket.” For older infants, encourage them to pull the blanket away themselves, helping them practice object permanence and understanding that objects and people exist even when hidden.

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Activity: Family Pics

Show photos of infants' family members during lap or tummy time. Point to one person in each photo, saying "one grandma" or "one brother" to introduce number 1. Name each family member clearly, watching for recognition or excitement. For older infants, offer photos to hold (laminated if possible) to support connection with loved ones.

	May focus on the puppets’ faces with interest.		May smile, babble, or reach for puppets.	
Activity: Puppets				
Use soft puppets with diverse faces and simple features to introduce social awareness. Move puppets slowly, greeting infants with phrases like “hello, friend!” Emphasize letter T by using a tiger or turtle puppet if available, saying “T is for tiger!” For older infants, encourage gentle touching of puppets to build early social connections.

Activity: Circle Songs				
Sit with infants in a circle (or semi-circle) and sing simple songs like “If You’re Happy and You Know It.” Emphasize “circle” by saying, “We’re sitting in a circle together!” For older infants, encourage simple movements like clapping or patting legs along with the song, fostering early group socialization and sense of belonging.

	May look at or touch stuffed animals during setup.	May reach for or hug stuffed animals during picnic play.
<p>Activity: Stuffed Picnic</p> <p>Arrange stuffed animals in a circle around infants on a blanket, calling it a “picnic.” Model offering pretend food to stuffed friends, saying words like “share” and “eat.” For older infants, encourage giving pretend food to stuffed animals themselves, practicing early sharing and social participation through simple pretend play.</p>
