Activity: Picnic Discussion

Gather children in a circle to talk about what a picnic is and if they’ve been on one. Prompt them with questions like, “What do you bring to a picnic?” or “Who do you go with?” Encourage children to share memories, helping them connect personal experiences to new learning about picnics. Support social skills by modeling listening and turn-taking.
