Activity: Peekaboo with Blanket				
Use a soft blanket to play peekaboo with infants. Say each child’s name during the game: “Where’s Jordan? Peekaboo!” This simple game supports identity recognition and awareness of social interaction. Older infants may begin to initiate peekaboo themselves or giggle when others are revealed.

<p><b>Activity: <i>Family Faces Photos</i></b></p> <p>Display laminated photos of each infant's family. Sit with children and point to each person in the photo, saying names and relationships: "That's mommy. That's your big brother." Encourage older infants to repeat names or point to people. This activity supports identity and connection to the people who care for them.</p>

	May look from photo to the caregiver and smile or vocalize.		May try to match or name their caregiver’s face.	
Activity: Caregiver Faces Matching				
Create simple picture cards of classroom teachers and staff. Sit with infants and show the cards while saying, “That’s Miss Alex,” or “Where’s Mr. Daniel?” For older infants, point to a real caregiver and then their photo. This helps build recognition and a sense of community in the classroom.

Activity: Tent Peek Game				
Set up a small pop-up tent or blanket fort in the play area. Take turns with infants crawling in and out, saying phrases like, “You’re inside the tent!” or “You peeked out!” This playful spatial game also supports building awareness of position, place, and personal identity within space.

	May sit quietly and look at others on the blanket.	May mimic eating, offer food toys, or interact with peers.
<p><b>Activity: <i>Family Picnic Blanket</i></b></p> <p>Spread out a large blanket and set up a pretend picnic with food, toys, and plush friends. Invite infants to join and interact at their own pace. Use phrases like “We’re sharing” or “Let’s sit together.” This gentle group activity builds social awareness and a sense of community while modeling cooperative behavior.</p>
