Activity: Sensory Storyboard - "Wash Hands" Routine

Use laminated cards showing a simple sequence like washing hands. Place them in order and describe each one aloud: "Turn on water... rub hands... dry hands." Let infants touch the cards and repeat words slowly with gestures. Reinforce through repetition and touch.

Activity: Puppet Talk with Gesture Words

Use a soft puppet to model key "safety" gesture words: stop, go, help, hug. Have the puppet wave, stop, and ask for help. Encourage infants to respond with movements or sounds. Pause for their reactions and repeat key words gently. Puppets support turn-taking and early language interaction.

Activity: Storytime Sing-Along - "Clean Up" Song with Motions

Sing a short clean-up or safety-themed song (e.g., "This Is the Way We Wash Our Hands") while showing the motions. Gently guide infant hands or mimic together. Encourage repetition and allow infants to hear the rhythm of the language.
