Indicators	Younger Infants	Older Infants
	Watches as stars move overhead or on the wall.	Reaches for or tracks star shapes when pointed out.
Activity: Red Star Mobile Overhead Hang soft or laminated red star shapes above a crib or play mat. Encourage infants to reach, kick, or gaze at the shapes as they move. Talk about what they see, using language like “Look at the red star!” or “The star is up high!” to begin building shape and position vocabulary.

Indicators	Younger Infants	Older Infants
	Touches or bats at one object at a time with assistance.	Attempts to pat or grasp multiple objects one after the other.
<p>Activity: Touch & Count Stars (1-3)</p> <p>Place three large foam or felt stars on the floor or tray. As infants explore them, say, “One star,” “Two stars,” “Three stars,” while gently tapping each one. Repeat multiple times during the day to help infants connect visual and verbal counting in a calm, engaging way.</p>

	Presses or pats sticker dots with support.		Chooses where to press stickers or pats specific colors.	
Activity: Sticker Star Sensory Strip				
Tape a star cutout to the table or floor and place a few red stickers or soft puffs on it. Let infants explore by touching or removing the stickers. Use counting words as you guide their fingers: “You touched one sticker... now two!” This helps infants begin to associate numbers with action and visuals.

	Looks at and touches colored objects placed near them.	Touches or reaches toward the matching colored item.
Activity: Red vs. Not Red Toy Play Offer two sets of toys - one group of red items and one group of mixed colors. Guide infants in exploring the toys, saying, "This one is red... this one is blue." Over time, point out the similarities and differences, supporting early color recognition and comparison through repetition.

	Explores star-shaped items with hands or mouth.	Searches for or selects a star shape when prompted.
Activity: Star Shape Tray Exploration Provide a tray or low bin filled with baby-safe star shapes in different sizes and textures. Let infants grab, mouth, or shake the stars. Say, “You found a star!” each time to help build shape-word connection. Encourage rolling, tapping, or clapping the items to engage curiosity.
