Activity: Read Jump, Frog, Jump! and Discuss

Invite children to gather on the carpet or in circle time. Read the story *Jump*, *Frog*, *Jump*! using expressive voices and body movements. Encourage children to join in repeating the phrase "Jump, frog, jump!" as it appears in the story. Pause after key moments and ask open-ended questions like "What do you think will happen next?" or "Why did the frog jump?"

After reading, guide a short group discussion using visual props or story sequencing cards. Encourage children to describe what the frog did and why, using complete sentences or descriptive words.

Activity: Read Scaredy Squirrel Goes Camping

Gather children and read the story aloud with enthusiasm, pausing to show the pictures of Scaredy's camping checklist and nervous expressions. Emphasize words like "camping" and "squirrel." After reading, ask review questions such as: "Why didn't Scaredy want to go camping at first?" or "What made him change his mind?"
