Activity: Dramatic Play: Dentist Station (Stuffed Animals)

Set up a cozy dentist corner with a small chair and stuffed animals. Model a short script: "open," "ah," "brush," "all done," then let children choose to be dentist or helper. Keep the routine predictable so toddlers can repeat the sequence independently. Rotate roles so everyone practices asking for a turn and returning props when finished.

	Follows a simple picture cue to start or stop play.	Uses a simple signal to begin or end and waits for a turn with support.

Activity: Open and Close Clinic (Appointments and Waiting Chairs)

Place two chairs for a tiny "waiting area" and a picture sign that flips between OPEN and CLOSED. Practice opening the clinic together, inviting one child at a time to "see the dentist," and then closing it for clean up. Emphasize using the sign to guide turns and transitions. End with a group "great job" clap and flip the sign to CLOSED.

	Places one or two blocks with encouragement.	Persists to stack four or more and tries again after a fall.

Activity: Gray Block Towers (Try for Seven)

Offer gray or neutral blocks and invite children to build a tower together. Count each block as it stacks and cheer attempts to reach seven. When towers fall, model "try again" language and slow hands. Encourage variations like building a "long oblong road" if stacking feels tricky.

	Explores pulling ribbons with hand-over-hand support.	Threads or pushes ribbons through holes with growing control.

Activity: Sensory Bin: Floss Ribbons Pull and Thread

Prepare a shallow bin with wide fabric ribbons and colanders or baskets with big holes. Show how to pull a "floss ribbon" through, then invite toddlers to take turns exploring. Name the actions (pull, push, stop) and celebrate small successes. Offer a second bin for finished ribbons so clean up is part of the routine.
