<p>Activity: Toothbrush Song and Dance</p> <p>Play your toothbrush song and model easy motions: up, down, circle, big smile. Invite children to move with you, then pause and restart to give clear entry points. Repeat the chorus so toddlers can join familiar parts. End with a freeze-and-smile pose.</p>

	Waves a scarf and stops with adult cue.		Changes speed (slow/fast) and freezes on cue.	

Activity: Freeze Dance with Gray Scarves

Give each child a soft gray scarf. Dance to short music clips, calling slow and fast, then pause for a freeze. Invite children to make an oblong line on the floor with their scarf before the final freeze for shape practice. Collect scarves with a “toss to the basket” game.

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<p>Activity: Rhythm Sticks: Brush Beat</p> <p>Hand each child a pair of short rhythm sticks or foam batons. Lead a simple pattern that mimics brushing (tap-tap, circle, tap). Alternate quiet and loud to build control and attention. Close by tapping seven gentle beats together.</p>

Activity: **Fingerpaint Shades of Gray**

Offer trays with light, medium, and dark gray non-toxic paint. Tape paper to tables and encourage full-hand swirls, then fingertip lines. Name what you see and invite children to find “light” and “dark.” Dry flat and display at child height.

	Press and poke the dough with hands.	Rolls snakes or pats flat shapes with simple tools.
<p>Activity: Playdough Fun: Press, Roll, Create</p> <p>Provide soft, unscented playdough with big, safe tools. Model pressing palms, rolling with a chunky roller, and making simple “tooth” or “brush” shapes if children are interested. Focus on the feel and effort rather than the product. Celebrate strong hands and clean up together.</p>
