#### Activity: Music Sway-Toothbrush Song

Hold babies securely or seat them supported while you sing your toothbrush song softly. Keep the beat with gentle knee pats or rocking, and pause before the chorus so infants can coo or smile. Repeat once a little faster to keep attention, then finish with a big grin and "all clean!" pose.

	Tracks the floating scarf and reaches to touch.	Waves scarf, changes speed with music, and pauses on "freeze."

#### Activity: Dance with Scarves-Freeze & Float

Give each infant a soft, lightweight scarf. Play short music clips and model slow **float** movements, then a gentle **freeze** when the music stops. Support babies to wave or grasp the scarf and celebrate any attempt to stop with the group. End by "toss to the basket" to close the activity.

#### Activity: No-Mess Paint Bag- Shades of Gray

Fill a zip bag with small blobs of light and dark gray tempera, seal securely, and tape to the table. Invite infants to press, pat, and drag fingers to mix swirls. Name what you see—*light, dark, smooth*—and snap a photo of each child exploring to "present" on your wall. Remove and discard the bag after use.

#### Activity: Maraca Shake & Stop

Hand each infant a soft maraca or sealed shaker. Lead a simple pattern: shake, shake, stop, using your voice and a clear hand signal. Explore quiet and loud, slow and fast, always returning to a gentle stop. Praise the group for listening "like musicians."

	Watches the pretend routine and reaches for the prop.	Imitates one step (wipe mouth, open "ah," or show smile) with support.

### Activity: Dramatic Play- Wipe, Brush, Smile

Use a doll to act out a tiny care sequence: wipe mouth, gentle brush motion in the air, big smile. Offer the doll for a brief, supported turn so infants can touch or hold a prop. Keep language simple and rhythmic so babies learn the steps through repetition. Finish with a group "smile!" for a joyful close.
