	Lifts head briefly and turns it to one side with support.	Pushes up on forearms, reaches toward a toy, or pivots during tummy time.

Activity: Tummy Time on Circle Mats

Place babies on soft circle mats with a mirror or high-contrast toy just within view. Coach tiny pushes like "lift... look... reach" and reposition elbows under shoulders to encourage weight bearing. Slide a toy slowly in a small arc so infants track and rotate. Offer frequent short breaks to keep the experience positive, then return for another brief try.

	Maintains a supported sit for several seconds while holding a ring.	Reaches across midline for a ring and returns to upright with minimal support.

Activity: Supported Sit and Ring Reach

Seat infants with a U-shaped pillow or your knees behind for trunk support. Present a large ring slightly to the side to promote a cross-body reach, then offer the other hand to switch and transfer. Name body parts as you help, "hands on, tummy tall," and let babies bang or mouth the ring before offering another reach. End with a gentle stretch up and a smile.

	Pulls to stand with assistance and shifts weight with support.	Cruises along a low surface or pushes a stable walker with control.

Activity: Cruise and Push Toy Parade

Set up a safe path along low furniture or a sturdy push toy. Help infants plant feet wide, stand tall, and take slow side steps while holding the surface, narrating "step... step... step..." For walkers, model hands on the push bar and take a slow parade to a taped finish line. Reinforce safety, two hands on, eyes forward, adult close, then celebrate with claps at the finish.

	Explores a teether with gums and brings hands to midline.	Alternates side-to-side chewing and imitates simple oral sounds.

Activity: Teether Time

Offer chilled (not frozen) teethers and guide infants to hold at midline and bring to the mouth. Model gentle side-to-side chewing, quiet lip pops, and a relaxed "ah" to build mouth movement variety. Pause between tries so babies notice the feel and reset posture. Wash teethers as needed and store them to reinforce healthy practice.

	Accepts adult support at the sink and tolerates water over hands.	Reaches to the water stream, rubs hands together with soap, and helps dry hands.

Activity: Handwashing at the Sink

Bring infants to the sink one at a time (or two with two adults), using a non-slip step or secure hip hold. Warm the water, help the baby wet hands, then pump a small amount of gentle soap into their palms and **hand-over-hand** rub "wash, wash." Rinse under the stream, helping turn hands to clean fronts and backs, then guide to a paper towel to pat dry and drop in the trash. Narrate the 3 steps every time: "water, soap, dry" so the sequence becomes familiar. Stay within arm's reach at all times; never leave a child at the sink unattended.
