Activity: Inside a Tooth Craft

Show a diagram of a tooth and introduce enamel, dentin, and pulp. Children color and assemble a large tooth cross-section, adding red yarn to represent the pulp's blood vessels. Discuss how the hard outside protects the softer inside and why brushing helps keep the whole tooth healthy.

	May sort foods into two groups with visual cues.	May explain why a food goes in "healthy for teeth" or "sugary."

Activity: Healthy vs. Not Healthy

Display food/drink picture cards and two tooth posters (happy tooth/sad tooth). Children classify each card, discussing texture and sugar content in simple terms. Emphasize that water, milk alternatives, crunchy veggies, and cheese-like snacks help teeth, while sugary drinks and sticky candies can cause "sugar bugs."

Activity: Tooth Care Observation Chart

Create a simple class chart with two rows "Brushed this morning" and "Brushed last night." Students place a sticker for themselves as they report. Discuss what the class notices (more morning or night stickers) and break down a good brushing routine into small steps we can all follow.

	May observe and describe color/texture changes with support.	May predict which liquid will stain more and tell what they noticed.

Activity: Plaque Attack Experiment

Place boiled eggs in clear cups of soda/tea/juice and one in water as a control. Invite predictions, then observe over time for staining ("plaque"). Compare shells and talk about how brushing helps remove build-up. Reinforce safety: we never drink experiment liquids.

	May arrange two to three pictures to show a simple routine.	May order all steps for brushing and explain what comes next.

Activity: Brushing Sequence Worksheet

Give students a cut-and-paste worksheet showing steps of brushing (wet brush, add paste, brush all sides, spit/rinse, smile). Children cut, arrange, and glue the pictures in order, then talk through the routine using simple transition words like "first," "next," and "last."
