	Look at a familiar face in a photo and quietly to your voice.		Reaches toward a photo, vocalizes, or looks between the picture and the caregiver.	
Activity: Family Photo Peek & Name Sit with a small basket of laminated family photos and show one picture at a time close to your face. Name the people with a warm tone (“Mommy... Daddy... you!”) and pause so the baby can gaze, smile, or reach. Offer the photo for a brief, gentle touch while you repeat the name to strengthen recognition. If appropriate, model a simple gesture such as a wave or a blown kiss and celebrate any attempt. Rotate two or three photos so each infant experiences a short, predictable turn.

	Watch a 2-3 step routine with calm attention.		Anticipates the next step and imitates one motion (open mouth, smile).	

Activity: **Care Routine Demo: Wipe-Brush-Smile**

Use a doll to model a tiny routine: wipe mouth, pretend to brush, and show a smile. Say the steps slowly, “first wipe, next brush, last smile,” and pair each word with a clear gesture. Invite the baby to touch the cloth or hold the (clean, adult-held) brush while you repeat the steps. End by mirroring the infant’s expression in a small mirror and saying “all done,” reinforcing the beginning and end of a sequence.

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<p>Activity: Faces Imitation with Gentle Touch</p> <p>Sit eye-to-eye and model a friendly smile, then an “open mouth-ah.” Wait for the baby’s response and narrate what you see (“I see your smile”). Introduce a single classroom expectation, “gentle touch,” by guiding the baby’s hand to rest softly on your shoulder, then praising the softness. Repeat the pattern with another adult or peer nearby so infants practice noticing faces and using calm hands. Keep turns brief and end with a group wave.</p>

	Attends to the “cover and reveal” rhythm and smiles at the reveal.		Pulls the blanket to reveal a peer or adult and waits for a short cue to take a turn.	
Activity: Peekaboo Turn-Taking Blanket Place two infants facing you with a light scarf or baby blanket between. Say “ready... set... peekaboo!” as you lift and drop the fabric, encouraging giggles and eye contact. Invite an older infant to pull the blanket down on the next cue, then help them wait while a peer gets the following turn. Name the order (“your turn... now friend’s turn”) to reinforce simple sequencing within a social routine.

	Looks toward a named helper and stills or smiles.	Waves or vocalizes “ba/da” when prompted and repeats the action.
<p>Activity: Thank-You Waves to Helpers</p> <p>During a natural transition, gather near the doorway or a display of classroom helper photos. Point to each helper, name them, and model a slow wave with “thank you.” Support infants to lift a hand or wiggle fingers; mirror their attempts and celebrate every wave. Finish by clapping once for each helper so babies experience a shared act of appreciation.</p>
