Activity: Read Eating the Alphabet

Sit with infants in a cozy area and read aloud from *Eating the Alphabet*. Hold the book close so they can clearly see the bright fruit and vegetable pictures. Use an engaging tone of voice and slowly say the fruit names, pausing on the letter **Bb** and fruits like bananas or blueberries. Encourage older infants to point or reach for the pictures, while younger infants simply enjoy listening and watching.

Activity: Reread Eating the Alphabet

Read the book again, focusing on repetition so infants hear the same words and see the same pictures as Day 1. Pause on each page a little longer to let infants observe and process the images. Emphasize fruits beginning with $\bf B$ (banana, blueberry) by repeating them two or three times. Encourage older infants to make sounds or gestures when they see a favorite fruit.

	May focus eyes on pictures during tummy time.	May reach for or pat pictures while babbling.

Activity: Fruit Picture Cards Tummy Time

Lay out laminated fruit picture cards on the floor during tummy time. Place infants on their tummies so they can look at and reach for the cards. Name each fruit slowly while pointing to it, giving infants exposure to new words. Encourage older infants to touch or hold the cards and repeat simple sounds like "b-b-b" for banana.

Activity: "B is for Banana" Chant

Hold up a real banana or toy banana and say slowly, "B is for banana. Banana starts with B." Repeat the word banana several times, exaggerating the /b/ sound. Add a rhythm by clapping your hands or tapping a drum softly to keep infants engaged. Encourage older infants to clap along while repeating "B-b-banana!"

Activity: Fruit Picture Review

Spread out the fruit picture cards you've used throughout the week. Hold up each one and name the fruit clearly while making eye contact with the infants. Pause after each word to allow for cooing, babbling, or hand motions. Repeat key fruits, especially those starting with **B**, and celebrate any attempts at sound-making or pointing.
