Activity: Water Play with Sponges

Provide small infant-safe sponges in a shallow tray of water. Encourage infants to touch, squeeze, and move the sponges. Teachers describe the textures and changes ("wet," "squishy," "dry") to build vocabulary.

Activity: Rocket Sensory Bag

Create a sealed sensory bag filled with gel, glitter, and small rocket cutouts. Place on the floor for tummy time or lap play. Infants press and push the rockets inside, watching them move. Teachers describe the movement to encourage curiosity.

Activity: Planet Earth Ball Roll

Introduce a soft Earth-themed ball. During floor time, roll the ball gently toward infants and encourage them to push or roll it back. As the ball moves, teachers say "Earth rolls round and round," linking play with real-world concepts.

Activity: Day & Night Picture Cards

Show large laminated pictures of the sun and moon. Say "Day - Sun" and "Night - Moon" while pointing to each. Allow infants to touch or hold the cards. Older infants practice matching a toy (like a star or sun rattle) with the correct picture.

	May splash or watch items float/move.	May drop objects in water and observe sink/float.

Activity: Sink or Float Sensory Tub

Fill a shallow tub with water and add lightweight floating toys (ducks, boats) and heavier but safe items (blocks). Let infants explore by splashing or dropping toys into the tub. Teachers describe the results ("The duck floats!" "The block sinks!").
