Play lively Hispanic music followed by calm, gentle music. Point to feeling cards (happy, calm) and label the emotions. Encourage older infants to clap or point when asked "Happy?" or "Calm?"

	Provide safe infant mirrors. Encourage infants to look, smile, and interact with their reflection. Say, "That's you!" and model waving. This builds self-awareness and early social recognition.
