### Activity: Autumn Leaf Handprint Craft

Children will create autumn leaves using handprints as the base. They will dip their hands in fall-colored paints (red, yellow, orange, brown) and stamp them on paper. Younger preschoolers will focus on the process of stamping and color mixing. Older preschoolers will extend by adding details such as stems, a tree, or a background scene. Teachers will lead a discussion about fall changes to connect art with the season.

### Resources/Materials

- Washable paints (fall colors)

- Paintbrushes/sponges

### Activity: Shape Drawing

Children will use shapes learned this month (hexagon, octagon, oblong, circle, square, triangle) to create imaginative drawings. Younger preschoolers may trace or glue precut shapes to form a simple object. Older preschoolers will be encouraged to draw their own shapes, combine them in creative ways, and add written labels or sentences describing their creation.

# Activity: Music & Movement Review

Children will review favorite movement songs from earlier weeks (e.g., "Freeze Dance," "If You're Happy and You Know It"). Younger preschoolers will clap, stomp, and sway to the beat. Older preschoolers will be encouraged to suggest their own dance moves or lead a part of the activity. Teachers will prompt reflection on how music makes us feel.
