#### Activity: Learn about César Chávez

The teacher will show a short story or picture book page about César Chávez and his work for farmworkers. Children will talk about how he helped people work together to be treated fairly. Younger preschoolers will identify Chávez as a helper and draw a picture of someone helping. Older preschoolers will write or dictate a sentence about fairness (e.g., "He wanted people to be treated kind").

### Activity: Community Helpers Recall

Children will review the community helpers studied earlier in the month. As a group, the teacher will display helper cards (doctor, firefighter, teacher, dentist) and discuss what each does. Younger preschoolers will match helpers with their tools or uniforms. Older preschoolers will be challenged to explain why helpers are important and write/draw their favorite community helper.

#### Activity: Learn about Frida Kahlo

The teacher will introduce Frida Kahlo as a famous Mexican artist. Children will view a few age-appropriate pictures of her art. Younger preschoolers will make a simple drawing of themselves to connect to Frida's self-portraits. Older preschoolers will be encouraged to add details or colors that show something special about them. A class discussion will highlight that artists use their work to show their identity.

### Activity: Map & Flag Review

Children will review the U.S. flag and the flag of Mexico. The teacher will point to a map and show where the U.S. and Mexico are located. Younger preschoolers will color a U.S. or the Mexico flag. Older preschoolers will try to place both flags on a simple world map and describe how they are alike or different.

### Activity: Learn about Roberto Clemente

The teacher will introduce Roberto Clemente as a Puerto Rican baseball player who is remembered for helping others. Younger preschoolers will be shown a baseball and asked to connect it to his sport. Older preschoolers will draw themselves playing a sport or helping others, and write/dictate a short sentence. A class discussion will highlight that heroes can be athletes, artists, or helpers who care for people.
