Activity: Storytime - The Little Old Lady Who Was Not Afraid of Anything

Teachers will read aloud, showing the colorful pictures. Younger infants will listen and track the teacher's voice, while older infants will be encouraged to point to or pat pictures as they appear. Teachers can repeat sound words like "clomp, clomp" and invite babies to imitate sounds.

Activity: Storytime - Scarecrow

Teachers will share the book with big illustrations and guide infants' attention by pointing and naming details ("This is the scarecrow's hat"). Younger infants will focus on listening and looking, while older infants will practice pointing or naming objects. Teachers can imitate animal sounds from the book to add engagement.

Activity: Fingerplay - "Five Little Pumpkins"

Teachers will perform the "Five Little Pumpkins" rhyme using hand motions. Younger infants will watch closely and listen to rhythm and rhyme. Older infants may begin to copy simple movements, clap, or vocalize along. Teachers may also use small pumpkin props to hold while chanting the rhyme.

Younger infants will enjoy holding and mouthing the books, while older infants will practice turning pages and pointing at pictures. Teachers will sit with small groups or individuals, naming pictures like "cow," "leaf," or "scarecrow." This activity promotes early book handling skills.
