Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	May color pictures of the elephant or egg with teacher support.	May say the letter Ee and repeat the sound /e/ while coloring.

Activity: **Ee Coloring Sheet (Elephant, Egg)**

Teachers will introduce the letter Ee by showing children how it looks in both uppercase and lowercase. Students will then color a worksheet with pictures of Ee objects such as an elephant and an egg. Younger toddlers will focus on scribbling and naming one picture, while older toddlers will practice saying the letter and sound. Teachers will emphasize repetition to build recognition.

	May touch or move fingers in sand as the teacher models the letter Ee.	May attempt to draw Ee in sand with finger.

Activity: Letter Ee Sand/Salt Tray

Teachers will prepare shallow trays filled with sand. Children will practice tracing the letter Ee with their fingers. Younger toddlers may simply explore the texture of the sand, while older toddlers will attempt to draw the letter. Teachers will say the sound /e/ while children trace to reinforce the letter-sound connection.

	May match identical pictures (egg to egg).	May say the word and identify if it begins with Ee.

Activity: Ee Picture Cards (Match & Say)

Children will play a matching game with simple picture cards of Ee words such as egg, ear, elephant. Younger toddlers will practice matching identical pictures, while older toddlers will say the word aloud and emphasize the /e/ sound at the beginning. Teachers will model pronunciation and celebrate when children hear or say the letter sound.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	May point to one picture out of two when asked, "Which one starts with Ee?"	May say the word that starts with Ee and repeat the /e/ sound.

Activity: **Beginning Sound Game (Ee Choice)**

Teachers will show toddlers two pictures at a time- one starting with Ee (egg) and one not (ball). Children will choose the picture that begins with the letter Ee. Younger toddlers will respond by pointing, while older toddlers will say the word and repeat the sound. This simple game reinforces sound recognition in a playful way.

	May dab or color lowercase e with teacher help.	May identify lowercase e independently and dab multiple times.

Activity: **Dab the Lowercase e**

Children will use dot markers to find and dab the lowercase e on a worksheet filled with mixed letters. Younger toddlers will dab with help and repeat the letter's name, while older toddlers will identify lowercase e independently. Teachers will model saying the sound /e/ each time the letter is marked. This reinforces letter recognition in a fun, hands-on way.
