Activity: Ee Sound Play (Face-to-Face)

Teachers will sit close to infants and repeat the /e/ sound slowly and clearly while making expressive faces. Younger infants will focus on watching the teacher's mouth movements, while older infants may babble or try to repeat the sound. This activity helps infants connect sound, facial expression, and early speech development.

Activity: **Ee Object Basket**

Teachers will place safe objects or toys beginning with Ee (egg shaker, envelope picture card, elephant toy) in a basket. Infants will be invited to explore the objects as teachers say each name slowly. Younger infants may simply touch and explore, while older infants will point or hold up objects as they hear the words.

Activity: Felt Letter Ee

Teachers will present a large letter Ee cut out of felt for tactile exploration. Younger infants may pat or squeeze the soft texture, while older infants will attempt to trace the shape with their finger. Teachers will repeat "Ee" and connect it to a word like "egg" each time the letter is touched.

Activity: Ee Song ("Ee says /e/")

Teachers will sing a short, repetitive song to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell": "*Ee says /e/, Ee says /e/, every letter makes a sound, Ee says /e/.*" Younger infants will enjoy clapping or swaying to the rhythm, while older infants may babble or echo the /e/ sound during the song.

Activity: ABC Song

Teachers will sing the ABC Song with the group while encouraging movement (bouncing, clapping). Afterward, teachers will show simple picture cards of Ee words (egg, ear, elephant) and repeat them slowly. Younger infants will enjoy the rhythm of the song, while older infants may respond by pointing or vocalizing when shown the Ee cards. This combines music, rhythm, and early phonics awareness.
