Activity: Free Block Play

Children will have open play time with blocks, cones, and toy tools. Younger toddlers may explore blocks by stacking, knocking down, or carrying them. Older toddlers will try to build simple towers, houses, or roads. Teachers will encourage sharing and talking with peers while playing.

Activity: Build Together

Children will build one large structure as a group, such as a road or a tower. Younger toddlers will participate by adding blocks or watching peers. Older toddlers will cooperate to plan and finish the structure, practicing patience and persistence. Teachers will highlight teamwork by saying, "Look what you built together!"

Activity: Tool Matching

Teachers will show real or toy tools (hammer, wrench, tape measure) with picture cards. Younger toddlers will match the tool to its picture. Older toddlers will try to name the tool and explain how it's used, such as "hammer hits." Teachers may extend by encouraging pretend play with the tools.

Activity: Stronger Towers

Children will build towers with blocks and explore how to make them stronger. Younger toddlers will practice rebuilding when their towers fall. Older toddlers will be encouraged to make towers with a wide base or try stacking in different ways. Teachers will guide children to notice which towers stand taller and which fall quickly.

Activity: Teamwork Road Building

Children will work together to build a pretend "road" using blocks, cardboard strips, or tape on the floor. Younger toddlers may place blocks in a line to begin a road. Older toddlers will extend the road, connecting their pieces with others to make a larger path. Teachers will encourage children to drive toy trucks on their finished road together.
