Activity: Construction Vehicle Moves

Children will pretend to be construction vehicles using their bodies. Younger toddlers may scoop like an excavator or push like a bulldozer. Older toddlers will act out multiple vehicle movements in a sequence (dig, lift, dump). Teachers will encourage everyone to make engine sounds while moving to make the play lively and engaging.

Activity: Cone Walk

Teachers will set up cones in a line or zigzag path. Younger toddlers will practice walking or crawling around cones slowly. Older toddlers will be challenged to weave in and out or balance by stepping carefully between cones. Teachers will emphasize safety by modeling slow, careful steps.

Activity: Block Relay

Children will carry blocks from one side of the room to another. Younger toddlers will focus on carrying one block at a time. Older toddlers will be challenged to carry more than one block or try working as a team to move blocks faster. Teachers can extend by having children stack the blocks into a tower at the finish line.

Activity: Bulldozer Push

Children will pretend to be bulldozers by pushing objects across the room. Younger toddlers will push lightweight items like boxes or foam balls. Older toddlers will push heavier objects like big foam blocks, racing or working together in pairs. Teachers will encourage dramatic play by having children make bulldozer sounds.

Older toddlers will complete multi-step challenges such as carrying a block while walking a line, climbing, and crawling. Teachers will remind children to move safely while having fun.
