	May look at and focus on pictures of people in hats or uniforms.	May point to or vocalize when seeing familiar people or tools.

Activity: Look at Pictures of Builders

Teachers will show large, colorful pictures of builders wearing hard hats, using tools, or driving trucks. Younger infants will observe the faces and bright colors. Older infants may reach or point to the pictures as teachers describe what builders do: "Builders help make our homes strong."

	May touch or look at hats as teachers wear them.	May try on a hat or help place one on a friend or teacher.

Activity: Pretend Play with Hats

Teachers will offer clean, soft hats or hard hats for exploration. Younger infants will touch or look as teachers model wearing them. Older infants may place a hat on their head or hand it to a teacher, imitating adult actions. Teachers will talk about who wears hats and what jobs they do (builder, teacher, firefighter).

	May watch intently as blocks are stacked and moved.	May help add a block or knock down a tower with assistance.

Activity: Watch Teachers "Build" with Blocks

Teachers will model stacking soft blocks into towers, describing actions aloud: "I'm building a tall tower!" Younger infants will observe closely. Older infants will be invited to hand over or knock down blocks, participating in cooperative play. Teachers will emphasize working together and helping one another.

Activity: Family Construction Picture Board

Teachers will create a "construction family board" featuring each infant's family photos displayed on yellow or black paper. Younger infants will look at and recognize their loved ones. Older infants will point, smile, or pat the pictures as teachers name the family members aloud. This builds comfort, belonging, and recognition of self within a group.

Activity: "Who Helps Build Our Home?" Discussion

Teachers will show images of people who help us, such as builders, plumbers, electricians, and painters and connect it to infants' understanding of "home." Younger infants will observe and listen. Older infants may smile, clap, or point to the helpers. Teachers will repeat key words and phrases to connect people with their helpful roles.
