Activity: Turkey Feast Craft

Students color a plate template, then color, cut, and paste "dinner" foods onto the plate they decorated. Encourage children to choose colors and place items where they think they belong, talking about shapes and textures they notice. Invite them to add details (steam lines, tablecloth patterns) and sign their work to build ownership. Display finished plates for a brief "gallery walk" where peers compliment one thing they notice.

	May glue pre-cut parts onto a headband with assistance.	May assemble parts in sequence and personalize with drawn details.

Activity: Turkey Headband Craft

Students assemble a turkey headband by attaching eyes, beak, and wattle to a band, then adding paper "feathers." Model the sequence and name each part as children work to reinforce vocabulary. Invite them to draw patterns or "letter Jj" marks on feathers for extra fine-motor practice. After crafting, children try on headbands and role-play friendly turkeys in dramatic play.

Resources/Materials • Pre-cut headband strips, eyes, beaks, wattles, feathers • Glue sticks, stapler (adult use), crayons/markers	Key Vocabulary: headband, beak, wattle, feather, pattern	Support: Turkey Headband

	May imitate simple motions and join in a repeated chorus.	May coordinate movements to lyrics, start/stop on cue, and follow multi-step directions.

Activity: Music & Movement Turkey Hokey Pokey

Lead the class in a turkey-themed "Hokey Pokey," substituting movements like "put your wing in" and "shake your tail." Emphasize listening for cues and moving bodies safely in personal space. Add simple percussion (rhythm sticks or shakers) on the chorus to support steady beat. Pause between verses to ask which part was tricky and model how to try again.

	May join in the refrain and act out a single motion.	May sequence motions across verses and vary volume/tempo with the song.

Activity: Music & Movement Five Little Turkeys

Teach the song "Five Little Turkeys," using finger puppets or felt pieces to act out each verse. Invite children to stand and "waddle," "hide," or "flap" as the story-song changes, exploring soft vs. loud and slow vs. fast. Encourage counting down on fingers to connect movement with the lyrics. Finish with a quick encore where students choose the tempo.

Activity: Music & Movement Shake Your Tail Feather

Play an upbeat track and invite children to "shake their tail feathers" with scarves or paper feathers. Model a simple call-and-response pattern (shake, swish, freeze) and let children invent their own 2–3 step sequences to share. Add a mirroring round where partners copy each other's motions to build social awareness. Close with a calm sway/stretch to return bodies to ready-to-learn.
