	May touch and look at a feather with adult support.	May describe a simple property (soft, tickly) and show a preference.

Activity: Feather Feel & Compare

Offer **large** craft feathers and a few real, clean feathers on individual trays. Model gentle touching and simple words like "soft" and "smooth," then invite children to rub a feather on their hand, sleeve, and table. Ask which feather they like and why, prompting words or pointing. End by sorting feathers into two piles (soft vs. smooth, long vs. short) with lots of praise for safe, gentle hands.

	May look at and point to "baby" vs. "grown" pictures.	May match baby turkey (poult) to grown turkey and say baby or big.

Activity: Baby & Grown Turkey Match

Show two **large** laminated photos at a time: a baby turkey (poult) and an adult turkey. Name them, then invite children to hand you the baby or big when asked. Rotate several pairs so each child tries matching at least once. Finish by placing pictures on a simple two-column chart (Baby / Grown) together.

	May listen and imitate a sound with a gesture or voice.	May notice differences (quiet/loud, fast/slow) and copy a pattern.

Activity: Gobble Listening Lab

Play short, quiet clips of turkey calls and pause after each to ask, "What did you hear?" Model a gobble and invite children to try, then switch to **quiet** chirps and **loud** gobbles so they experience contrast. Add a simple pattern (gobble-clap-gobble) for children to echo. End with "sound choice" time, letting them pick quiet or loud and the class imitates safely together.

	May blow or wave to move a feather slightly.	May try different tools (hand fan, paper plate) and compare which moves the feather more.

Activity: Feather in the Wind

Place one **large** feather on a tray for each child. Show how a slow **blow** or a gentle **wave** with a paper plate moves the feather. Invite children to try both and notice which makes the feather travel farther. Keep it playful. Count "1-2-3 blow!" and end by letting feathers "rest" in a bowl so clean-up is calm and safe.

	May place one or two blocks together with support.	May stack several blocks to make a simple perch and adjust when it wobbles.

Activity: Build a Turkey Perch (Big Blocks)

Invite children to use **large** foam or wooden blocks to build a low "perch" for a stuffed turkey or pom-pom. Model safe stacking, "flat on flat," and show how to press gently to check wobble. Celebrate rebuilds by saying, "Try again!" and praise problem-solving when they widen the base. Finish with a quick "perch parade," placing the toy turkey on each child's structure for a turn.
