Activity: Count the Cows

Teachers will place large cow pictures or toys in front of the children and count them slowly aloud. Toddlers will tap or touch each cow as they count together. Older toddlers may place the correct number of cows on a mat labeled 1-5. The class will repeat several times with new sets to build counting familiarity.

Activity: Count the Chicken Eggs

Teachers will provide large plastic eggs and cups. Children will count each egg as they place it into one cup, practicing one-to-one correspondence. Older toddlers will repeat the activity with fewer or more eggs and compare which tray has more. A simple cleanup song will reinforce sequencing (in, in, in the cup).

Activity: Count the Ducks

Children will play at a shallow water table or sensory bin with three to five floating ducks. Teachers will lead the group in counting and scooping each duck out of the water. Older toddlers will notice and discuss which duck is big or small. Children will clap three times for three ducks, building rhythmic awareness.

Activity: Match the Sheep

Teachers will provide two large sheep figures or pictures and soft cotton balls. Children will match the sheep and then glue or place cotton onto them. Older toddlers may compare small and large cotton pieces, describing soft or fluffy as they work. The group will count the sheep together and finish with a "baa" sound cue.

	May place animals in two piles with guidance.	May sort by big/small or color and count how many in each group.

Activity: Farm Animal Count and Sort

Teachers will provide a basket of large plastic farm animals. Children will pick one animal at a time, name it, and place it into groups (big/small or by type). Older toddlers will count each group and say which one has more. Teachers will emphasize comparison words during cleanup and repeat counting one more time before ending the activity.
