	May imitate the /k/ sound and point to the big K.	May say the /k/ sound, name Kk, and match one K picture.

Activity: Letter Kk Sound Introduction

Teachers will show a large uppercase K and lowercase k and model the /k/ sound. Children will watch the teacher's mouth, then try making /k/ and tap once for the sound. Students will name or echo simple K words (kite, key, kangaroo) while touching the big K card. A final quick choice invites each child to point to K when shown K and another letter.

	Younger Toddlers	Older Toddlers
	May move to a beat and say /k/ on cue.	May pair a movement with /k/ and say a K word while moving.
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Activity: /k/ Sound Movement Game

Teachers will lead a simple call-and-response: when we move, we say /k. Children will stomp, clap, or kick gently while voicing /k/ together. The group will add quick K words to the beat (K / k / kite), keeping movements safe and slow. A short freeze game has children stop and show K fingers when the teacher shows the K card.

	May point to K on a page or card when prompted.	May find K among two or three letters and name it.

Activity: Find the Letter Kk

Teachers will place two or three large letter cards (K, M, A) on the floor or board. Children will hunt for K and tap it with a pointer or finger. The group will repeat with shuffled cards, saying K each time they find it. Older toddlers may try finding lowercase k among other lowercase letters.

	May trace or finger-write K on a textured surface with support.	May make simple strokes to form K/k with guidance.

Activity: Trace the Letter Kk

Teachers will model big-arm air writing for K and k, saying $K \dots / k /$ as they move. Children will finger-trace K on sand or gel bags, then try a jumbo crayon trace over a bold K outline. Adults will give light hand-over-hand support as needed and celebrate close attempts. A brief show-and-say lets each child point to their best K.

	May echo /k/ during a simple song.	May sing a short K chorus and say one K word.
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Activity: Kk Song and Sound Review

Teachers will teach a brief echo song featuring /k/ (e.g., "K.../k/.../k/... K is for kite"). Children will pat knees to the beat and join the /k/ parts. Picture prompts will help the group sing or say two or three K words. A quick review game ends the session: hold up K when you hear /k/.
