Activity: Match & Plant

The teacher can provide plant cards (e.g., tomato, flower, corn) and matching seed images or real seeds. Children will work to match each plant with its seed, then place it in a pretend planting tray or garden mat. The teacher can ask follow-up questions to promote curiosity and focus.

The teacher can create a collaborative play station with pretend plants or a real classroom plant area. Children work together to "water" and care for plants using cups, spray bottles, or watering cans. The teacher can model taking turns, gentle hands, and teamwork language like "Your turn next" or "Let's do this together."
