### Activity: 911 Song and Ribbon Dance

Teach children a simple safety song or chant about calling 911, paired with hand movements and marching beats. Add ribbon wands for creative movement as children dance along with the chorus. Use slow and fast tempos to explore rhythm changes. This activity introduces emergency awareness while promoting musical and physical expression.

#### Activity: Safety Rhythm Game

Set up a rhythm circle where children use instruments (or clapping and tapping) to copy and create simple patterns related to safety words like "stop-stop-go" or "hose-hat-gear." Guide them through repeating and creating their own sequences. Encourage them to share their rhythms with the group. This promotes auditory memory, pattern awareness, and expressive play.
