	May point to or touch pictures that look like something they do at home (bed, toys, table).		May name or gesture one simple rule they follow at home (clean up toys, gentle with pets).		
Activity: Rules at Home Picture Talk					
Sit with toddlers in a small group and show the Rules at Home picture chart. Name each picture in simple language (“pick up toys,” “put trash in the can,” “be gentle with puppy”) and invite children to point or clap when they see something they do at home. For each rule, ask short questions like “Who does this at home?” and “Is this a good choice?” letting children respond with hands, nods, or words. Keep it very visual and concrete, focusing on just a few rules that help keep everyone safe and happy.

	May point to or mark the picture that shows the bear making a good choice with adult support.	May choose which bear is following the rule and say “good” or “not good” or a short phrase.
<p>Activity: Rules at Home - Who Follows the Rules?</p> <p>Review a few pictures from the Rules at Home chart, reminding toddlers that rules help us stay safe. Show the Who Follows the Rules? worksheet with two bears in each picture. Model looking closely and deciding which bear is doing the “good choice” (sharing, cleaning up, gentle with things). Help toddlers circle, sticker, or lightly color the bear who is following the rule, one picture at a time, talking about what the bear is doing. Keep the pace slow and positive, praising children for noticing good choices.</p>

	May point to familiar school pictures (teacher, toys, table) and watch as the teacher labels rules.		May name or copy simple school rules like “sit,” “walk,” or “take turns.”	

Activity: Rules at School Picture Talk

Gather toddlers near the **Rules at School** picture chart and ask, “What do we do at school?” Point to each picture and describe it simply (“walking feet,” “hands to self,” “clean up toys,” “sit at the table”). Invite children to stand up and act out a few rules with you—for example, walking in place, sitting in a chair, or pretending to put toys in a basket. Choose 2–3 key rules to repeat as a group and connect them to your own classroom routines.

	May choose or point to the picture of the child who is following the classroom rule with support.	May say who is “nice” or “not nice” and connect it to a simple rule (no hitting, share toys).

Activity: Rules at School - Who Follows the Rules?

Show the **Who Follows the Rules?** school worksheet and explain that one bear is following the rule and one is not. For each pair of pictures, look together and describe the actions in toddler language (“This bear is sharing. This bear is grabbing.”). Ask children to point to or mark the bear who is doing the right thing. Offer stickers or a small stamp to place under the bear who follows the rule, reinforcing the language “good choice at school.”

	May choose a simple picture rule (no running, gentle hands) and help add it to the poster.		May name or act out a bakery rule (take turns, no throwing) and remember it during play.	

Activity: Gingy's Bakery Rules Poster

Tell children that Gingy's Bakery needs its own special rules so everyone can play safely and have fun. Show 3-4 simple picture rules (take turns, use gentle hands, keep pretend food out of mouths, help clean up) and talk briefly about each one. On a large poster, glue or tape the pictures and name the rule together, letting toddlers help press the pictures down. Hang the finished **Gingy's Bakery Rules Poster** near the dramatic play center and review the rules before bakery play, pointing to each picture and inviting children to copy the action.
