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Activity: “Gold Paint Bag Play”

Tape a sealed bag filled with gold paint to a table or mat. Encourage infants to pat, push, or hit the bag, watching the paint shift and spread. Name colors and shapes they create (“You made a gold line!”). This activity supports sensory awareness and early cause-effect understanding.

Activity: “Music & Movement: Wiggle Dance”

Play gentle upbeat music and wiggle a soft worm toy to the beat. Encourage infants to bounce, kick, or wave their arms while you sing or dance beside them. Repeat slow and fast motions to develop rhythm and body awareness.

Activity: “Finger Painting with Gold (Ziplock Bag)”

Seal gold paint inside a ziplock bag and tape it to the floor or highchair tray. Let infants pat and press the paint, watching it spread and move beneath their hands. Describe the texture and color while encouraging them to use both hands.

Activity: “Bubble Dance Play”

Play soft music and blow bubbles in the air while gently moving infants’ arms and legs to the rhythm. Encourage reaching, kicking, and clapping to “pop” bubbles while naming movements and repeating “dance, pop, float.”

Indicators	Younger Infants May watch ribbons move through the air.	Older Infants May grasp a ribbon wand and wave or shake it.

Activity: “Ribbon Flow & Shake”

Provide soft ribbon wands or scarves. Move ribbons gently in front of infants while playing relaxing music. Encourage grasping and waving movements, describing what they see (“The ribbon is floating up!”). Vary speed and direction to hold attention and build visual tracking.
