	May look at pictures, point to Carl, and imitate a simple wiggle motion.	May name Carl as a worm and tell one thing seen in the picture using a word or short phrase.
<p>Activity: “Read: Carl and the Meaning of Life – Picture Walk Wiggles”</p> <p>Do a slow picture walk, stopping to wonder, “Where is Carl?” and “What is he doing?” Invite toddlers to wiggle whenever Carl is on a page, then freeze to look closely. Encourage pointing and naming simple items (worm, dirt, leaf). End by choosing a favorite page and wiggling like Carl one more time.</p>

Activity: “Read: Carl and the Meaning of Life - Point & Name”

Revisit selected pages and play a quick “Point & Name” game: “Touch the worm... Touch the tunnel.” Offer wait time and cheer for attempts. Invite children to say a word or short phrase for what Carl does (dig, wiggle, hide). Finish by placing picture cards on the chart to review what we named today.

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Activity: “Read: Up in the Garden and Down in the Dirt – Garden Friends Motions”

Read short selections showing bees, worms, ants, and ladybugs. After each page, teach a simple motion (bee buzz with fingers, worm crawl on forearms, ant march, ladybug tiny steps). Ask, “Which friend is this?” and let children choose a motion to repeat. Close with a quick “friend parade” where each child picks one motion to perform.

Activity: "Read: Carl and the Meaning of Life - Who We Help Photo Cards"

Briefly revisit the pages that show how Carl helps. Show photo cards (family, teacher, friend, plant) and ask, "Who do we help?" Children select a card and share a word or short phrase while you echo-model. Create a small wall strip titled **We Help** with the cards the group chose.

Indicators	Younger Toddlers May echo one word or motion from a line of the poem.	Older Toddlers May echo short lines and pair motions with words from the poem.

Activity: “Wiggly Worm Poem - Echo & Actions”

Display the poem and read one line at a time; children **echo** key words and act them out (dig, wiggle, hide). Point to the picture cues and invite toddlers to touch the line as they move. End with a full-chorus read using soft voices, then loud voices, celebrating with a group wiggle.
