	May track bubbles with eyes and reach toward them.	May pat or pop a bubble in the air or on a surface.

### Activity: “Bubble Watch - Look, Reach, Pop”

Seat infants comfortably and blow a few slow bubbles, narrating “up... float... pop!” Encourage visual tracking and gentle reaching. Let bubbles land on a mat so babies can pat and hear a tiny pop. Repeat short rounds, varying speed and distance to keep attention.

	May grasp or rub one texture item.		May alternate between two textures and show a preference.	

### Activity: “Texture Play - Smooth vs. Bumpy”

Offer a small tray with large, safe textures: a silicone mitt (bumpy), soft microfiber cloth (smooth), and a large ribbed ball. Model slow hand-over-hand touches and name the feel. Encourage babies to press, rub, and switch items while you describe sensations.

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### Activity: “Watch the Water Pour”

Place a clear bin on a towel and slowly pour water from a clear pitcher, saying “pour... splash.” Invite infants to pat the water surface or tap a floating cup. Repeat short pours so babies can anticipate the stream and react.

	May hold and shake a sealed bottle briefly.		May shake, pause to look, and track light moving through the bottle.	

### Activity: “Sound & Light Shakers”

Provide sealed clear sensory bottles (water + a few gold ribbon pieces or large beads-fully sealed with hot glue/tape). Invite babies to shake and then hold to watch items drift. Dim lights slightly and sweep a flashlight across a bottle to highlight movement and sparkle.

<b>Indicators</b>	<b>Younger Infants</b>	<b>Older Infants</b>
	May watch a large toy float and pat the surface near it.	May push a floating toy gently and watch it move across the water.
<b>Activity: “Float &amp; Move - Big Toys in Water”</b>  Set a shallow water bin with <b>large</b> floating toys (rubber duck, big plastic “worm,” lightweight ball). Show how toys <b>float</b> and gently push to make them move, narrating “float... move... stop.” Invite infants to pat the water or nudge a toy and watch it glide.
