### Activity: "Music & Movement Mix-Up"

Use familiar songs like "Turkey Hokey Pokey" and a "Worm Wiggle" rhythm. Children explore different ways to move their bodies to the music and help invent simple movement patterns.

### Activity: "Dramatic Play: Farm & Garden Feast"

Set up a pretend feast using farm and garden foods. Children choose roles (farmer, cook, server, guest, animal) and act out preparing, serving, and enjoying a shared meal.
